the human kind.


I remember a metaphor he made that really stuck in my head: the human life compared with a theatre, a play.

Bonfire Night

Every year, Bonfire Night falls on the same day November 5th. People in Britain celebrate this day with fireworks, bonfires, sparklers and toffee apples because it's the anniversary of a failed attempt to blow up the Houses of Parliament in London. The history of Bonfire Night started in 1605 when a man named Guy Fawkes and a Gunpowder group tried to blow up King James I and his government. The reason why they did it was the religion. The Gunpowder group were Catholic and they wanted England to be Catholic again. The attack failed because one member of the group sent a letter to his friend who worked in Parliament, warning him about the attempt. The King's supporters got hold of the letter and the plot was stopped.



In November there are lots of places where people went and celebrated this day. You could watch a traditional Bonfire Night celebration with a funfair and fireworks in parks and the city centre. The biggest firework show was in Heaton Park where the fireworks lasted 15 minutes.




