The history of this symbol is connected with the Industrial Revolution. In the 1800s, Manchester was inundated by mills, in particular textile, that were commonly described as "hives".

Restaurants in Manchester

A famous building linked to this is the Beehive Mill, located in the discrict of Ancoats. It was a textile industry but it changed it's production and became a commercial store. Inside, there was also 'Sankeys Soap', an underground-refined nightclub. It was open for 23 years, but in January was sold to make flats.

In 1842, bees were incorporated into the Manchester City Council's coat of arms and so officially turned out as culture symbol.

Everyone can see bees on the bins, but also on the clock face of Palace Hotel, on the floor of Manchester Town Hall and on the crest of University of Manchester. On the university website it explains: "[This] is a symbol of hard work during the Industrial Revolution and represents the city's innovating and enterprising past".

After the Arena terrorist attack of May 2017, Manchester Tattoo's parlours appealed to ink bees for 50 as fundrising for the families of the victims.


